





Interview with Cecilia – CTO – Chief Technical Officer: Mexico

What do you do?

I am working as a CTO for Cablemás, the 2nd largest cable operator in México. My responsibilities are developing and guiding the company's technology strategy, evolving network architecture and my role includes the development of a technical operations structure to facilitate the company's rollout of new services.

Any Challenges?

Every project is a challenge and very unique, because the decisions have a direct impact in the business plan. Thus, the best pleasure in my job is the achievement of goals.

I really enjoy my job because I found a passion in the cable world.

What have been your most significant achievements?

My most significant achievements to date are the implementation of the Telephony service in Mexico, the innovated design of the SS7 Signalling Network, the Central Provisioning System Automatic for Data and Voice and the Automatic Ad Insertion System.

Later, most of these successes were replicated by different companies in Latin America.

What was your first day like?

7 years ago, in my first week in cable, I heard so many shortening during the meetings I never heard before. I didn't understand anything!

I felt the job was big for me because of my disorientation. I was wondering if these people, coincidently most foreign people, was speaking in a different language than Spanish. Few weeks later, I was using same shortening... and even more!!

Describe a typical day

My typical day at work includes searching and testing equipments and applications in a laboratory and studies, analysis and evaluations of solution's alternative.

It is necessary for me to be updated in theorical knowledge, practical and real experiences.

Tell us about your project work?

When the whole strategy or some of his parts are defined, I launch a project and I assume the role of Project Leader.

I travel very often to visit them, to achieve the knowledge of the new products or applications in real developments and travel also to participate in the industry's shows.

After 7 years in the cable industry and more than 15 years in the IT industry, I feel myself as a seasoned veteran of the networking and telecommunications industries. I said veteran, not old jeje

I am an active member of the Society of Cable Telecommunications Engineers (SCTE). This organization is a non-profit professional association that provides technical leadership for the telecommunications industry and serves its members through professional development, standards, certification and information to U.S. and 70 countries worldwide.

(CableLabs®) what is a non-profit research and development consortium that is dedicated to pursuing new cable telecommunications technologies and to helping its cable operator members integrate those technical advancements into their business objectives. The Cablelabs's members are located in the United States, Canada, Mexico, South America, Europe and Asia.

I am part of the Advisory Board of CedarPoint Communications, based in Derry, NH, USA. The Board is chosen by the company and it consists of the top industry leaders with proven capacity, knowledge and industry influence. I use to collaborate with the National Camera of the Cable Telecommunications (CANITEC).
